



Visual Storytelling

Fractured Fairy Tales

Introduction:

If pictures are worth a thousand words, you will rejoice in the opportunity to tell stories through digital images! This assignment can work in almost any classroom assignment (THINK: you could ask to do this again in the future!), but is best used to demonstrated understanding in novel studies!

Steps:

1. Students are to choose a fairy tale and read the story to familiarize themselves with the story.
2. Write out the main ideas/points/morals/themes on a brainstorming page that **YOU** create. *If you need help with ideas for a brainstorming format, please see your teacher.*
3. Rewrite your story, but put a spin on it. For example, mix two stories together, remix the plot line, alter the setting or change the main character's traits.
4. Decide how you will present your fractured fairy tale:
 - Stop-motion photography
 - Narrated iMovie
 - Green screen presentation
5. Decide which scenes you would like to capture to best portray the essences of your story. You should have at least 12 slides/visuals. Plan this out on the "**Blank Storyboard Planning Template**". You will need to complete this part by hand!
6. Once you have planned out your storyboard, show your brainstorming, planning template and rubric to your teacher for approval.
7. Create your digital component. This should take no more than 3 classes.
8. Hand in your finished project!
9. Complete the Stars & Stairs reflection on your assignment and hand this in to your teacher.
